# **Poster Presentation Guidelines**

Congratulations on acceptance for a poster presentation at the Predictive Models for Acute Oral Systemic Toxicity Workshop on April 11-12, 2018 at the William H. Natcher Conference Center, NIH Main Campus, Bethesda, MD. Please follow these guidelines for preparing and presenting your poster. Groups who have built several models using different approaches are welcome to bring more than one poster, we simply request that you let us know so we can ensure there are sufficient poster boards (please contact Agnes Karmaus at agnes.karmaus@nih.gov).

#### Poster Preparation

- Posters should be no larger than 8' wide by 4' high and no smaller than half this area.
- Poster heading should include title, authors, and affiliations, with title letters >1" high.
- Illustrations and text should be readable from 5' away. All lines should be heavily drawn.
- While authors should plan to be available to discuss their posters with workshop attendees during the Wednesday evening poster session (see below), posters should be understandable without oral explanation.
- Consider bringing handouts of your poster, or an envelope to collect business cards if you wish to share electronic copies of your poster after the workshop.

## Suggested information to include on posters

- What were the methods and descriptors used in the modeling?
- How many compounds were excluded by the model(s); what was the percent of available prediction set within the applicability domain?
- How did the model(s) perform overall?
- How did the model(s) perform when viewed in terms of diversity of chemical groups and functionality?
- How was uncertainty computed? (if it was)
- What mechanisms were included? (if characterized)

- For quantitative and category approaches, describe the degree of error in the incorrect estimates, (i.e. if the incorrect GHS category was predicted, was the estimate was too high or low and the degree of difference).
- Model availability, ease of use, and degree of technical competency required to use the model(s).

## Poster Display and Presentation

Posters will be available for viewing during breaks throughout the workshop, and will be attended at the poster session and reception from 5:00-6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, April 11, 2018.

- Presenters should plan to put up posters between 8:00 and 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday.
  NICEATM staff will be available to assist if needed and will provide pushpins for fastening posters to poster boards.
- The first author of each poster should be available for questions and discussion during the Wednesday evening poster session and reception. If the first author is not available for the poster session, he or she should arrange for a co-author to attend the poster.
- Posters should be removed from the display boards at the end of the reception on Wednesday at 6:30. Posters left behind after the reception will be discarded.
